The City Council of the City of Rocky Top, Tennessee, met at City Hall at 6:00 p.m., on 20th January 2022, for the regular scheduled meeting, with Mayor Tim Sharp presiding. On the roll call the following answered present:

Invocation

Mayor Sharp opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of Minutes

The motion to approve the minutes for the 16th December 2021 Beer Board and regularly scheduled meetings was made by Councilman Zack Green and was seconded by Councilwoman Denise Casteel. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
